God is able to cause us to grow and to be able to contain much more of the Holy Spirit's fullness and power. A better analogy might be a balloon, which can be 'full' of air even though it has very little air in it. When more air is blown in, the balloon expands and in a sense is 'more full.' — Systematic Theology page 782

In Scripture, being filled with the Spirit has many different consequences such as overcoming temptation (Luke 4:1); teaching with authority (Luke 4:14); speaking blessings (Luke 1:41); prophesying (Luke 1:67); powerful preaching (Acts 4:31); wisdom and maturity (Acts 6:3); compelling testimony (Acts 4:8); and faith (Acts 11:24). Many of these and other examples indicate that the filling came just at the right time and empowered the person for a special ministry. For each of us, then, we need to be seeking to do God's will as He leads us. And if we are fully submitted to Him, we can expect the filling of His Spirit again and again just in time to accomplish the works that He has prepared in advance for us to do.

Am I Filled With The Spirit?

Recently in our video breakout class with J D Greear, the idea of being filled with the Spirit was mentioned and it got me thinking. Being filled with the Spirit is one of the key ways we advance in maturity in the Christian life and it is one of the most important ways that God shapes us more and more to be like Jesus. Paul gives us this command: "Be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit" in Ephesians 5:18

As I was reading in Acts I noticed the Apostle Peter being filled repeatedly with the Holy Spirit. It all starts in Acts 2:4, on the day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit first comes after Jesus has gone to heaven. The Spirit filled all who were gathered and they testified to the assembled crowd in languages they did not know. Peter was there that day and was filled with the Spirit. Then, some time later, in Acts 4:8. again we read that Peter was filled with the Spirit but this time he spoke before the rulers and elders in Jerusalem. Then, in Acts 4:31, after Peter was back with the other believers, they were praying and we read that all of them were "filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly." A straightforward reading of these passages seems to indicate that the filling of the Holy Spirit can happened again and again. And Paul's command in Ephesians 5 agrees with that assumption since he uses a present tense imperative that could be translated "be continually filled with the Spirit."

But how can we be filled over and over again. If we are like a glass that has been filled to the brim with water, how can we be made more full of the Spirit? Wayne Grudem gives this helpful insight:

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers, and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing, and perfect will." Romans 12:1.2

The word transformed comes from the Greek word **metamorphosis**, the term we use to describe the process that changes the 'ugly' caterpillar into a beautiful butterfly. What a picture that presents. What a change takes place in this weed bound, leaf munching, unattractive 'worm'. **Metamorphosis!** The caterpillar attaches itself to a leaf or stem, a cocoon forms around it and things begin to happen inside it where nothing remains unchanged. The caterpillar gradually melts into a jellied, shapeless mass, with it only then beginning to form into what will become a gorgeous butterfly with large, dainty, colored wings. The 'ugly' is gone and emerging from the cocoon is a beauty.

This is the picture of the transformation the Christian goes through. "If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creature. The old has gone, the new is here." 2 Corinthians 5:17. We, in our ugly, greedy worm form, were thinking, talking, and acting sinfully, but then we are washed from our sins and indwelt by the Holy Spirit through whose power we 'are being transformed into His likeness'. 2 Corinthians 3:18 It is a heart change that yields a life change! Transformed by God's love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness, we become selfless, loving, devoted Christ-followers, radiating His light and beauty to our dark, confused, ugly, lost world. It is hard to imagine when you see a caterpillar that one day it will be a beautiful butterfly floating through the air. It is, often, equally as hard to imagine that us sinners can become a brand-new person displaying the attributes of Christ in our lives.

It is also hard to imagine that the beautiful butterflies we see floating around in the air were once ugly caterpillars. The change is so great. But isn't it just as difficult to imagine John, the apostle of love, was once 'a son of thunder'. Or that the apostle Paul, was once a killer of Christians. Or each of us, though once "we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son". Romans 5:10 This transformation means that we have "put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience, bearing with one another, forgiving each other". Colossians 3:12,13. We are becoming more like Christ. It is truly a **metamorphosis**! Nothing remains unchanged!
