There are people who are really struggling and some may have even given up on the Christian life because they believe that they have failed so badly that they have become unforgivable. Their struggle is really all about accepting the truth that forgiveness is available to them.

Some feel that due to the huge volume of their failures, or by the awfulness of their sins, they have crossed the line of being 'too bad to be forgiven'. But they are not! No one is ever unforgivable! Paul and Moses were both murderers, David was a murderer and an adulterer, and Peter denied he had ever known Jesus. All these found forgiveness.
